

# Sea Coast Mission Seeks Volunteers

**CHERRYFIELD** — The Maine Sea Coast Mission's Housing Ministry will continue its work this fall to help people prepare for the winter.

With a grant from Eastern Maine Funders, Keep ME Warm Kits from the Maine Cooperative Extension and community volunteers, the mission will help weatherize the homes and trail-

ers of low-income homeowners.

The projects will include banking trailers, insulating attics and basements, cleaning furnaces, installing new windows and installing Keep ME Warm kits.

Volunteers are needed to join this effort on Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 15 and 16.

Volunteers with any level of

skill will be put to work. Skilled carpenters and many people with a willingness to help are needed. Depending upon the work involved, usually six to eight volunteers will be assigned to a house or trailer.

There will be a spaghetti dinner while plans are made for the work weekend.
