Land & Sea Lecture: July 13th Only U.S. Female Swordfishing Captain Linda Greenlaw

Join us at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, July 13, for our Land & Sea Lecture with Isle au Haut resident, <u>Linda Greenlaw</u>. Ms. Greenlaw, America's only female swordfishing captain, came to public attention in Sebastian Junger's *The Perfect Storm* as "one of the best captains... on the entire east coast."

Greenlaw is author of many popular books including All Fishermen Are Liars and 2005 Recipes From A Very Small Island. She has received the U.S. Maritime Literature Award and the New England Book Award for Nonfiction, and is a popular speaker.

Downeast Campus: Seedlings Growing, Gardens Tilled

Our Downeast campus in Cherryfield features a quarter-acre organic pantry garden. Gena Norgaard, Food Pantry Manager and Master Gardener, started planting seedlings in the garden on Memorial Day weekend. University of Maine Cooperative Extension Master Gardeners and garden assistant Robert Murphy will help plant and care for the garden throughout the growing season.

Local farmer Michael Hayden also grows produce for a 10-week farm share program for children attending the Milbridge and Cherryfield elementary schools and Narraguagus High School. Each week approximately 250 children select fruits and vegetables to take home to share with their families. We are grateful to the Sewall Foundation for supporting the weekend food backpack and farm share programs.

The *Sunbeam* was near capacity cruising to Isle au Haut where the group loaded her top deck with bags of trash collected from the beach at Head Harbor.
