



Maine Seacoast Mission 2019 Scholarship Application

History: The Maine Seacoast Mission's scholarship program started in 1918. For 100 years the Mission has been supporting the educational efforts of students in coastal Downeast Maine. Our program is one of the few that will permit students to reapply for all four years of college as long as they meet our criteria.

There are 5 different scholarships available to those who reside in our service area.

The qualifications are listed below: Each have an EFC (expected family contribution) that may not exceed \$15,000

Sunbeam Scholarship \$2,000 award per year renewable for a total of up to \$8,000. The applicant must demonstrate:

- Financial Need
- Academic Promise
- Community Service
- Participation in extracurricular school activities

Ed Greaves Educational Center (EdGE) Scholarship \$2,500 award per year, renewable for a total of up to \$10,000 is limited to Narraguagus, Jonesport Beals and Machias high schools. The applicant must demonstrate all the qualifications required of the Sunbeam Scholarship and additionally:

- Be an active participant in the EdGE program for 5 years
- Be a volunteer devoting a minimum of 40 hours per year to the EdGE program
- Be employed as a member of the High School Assistant Staff in the EdGE program
- Written recommended by the Senior EdGE Staff

Angus MacDonald Scholarship \$3,000 award per year, renewable for a total of up to \$12,000. Awarded to an exceptional high school graduate. The applicant must demonstrate all the qualifications required of the Sunbeam Scholarship and additionally:

- Superior scholastic achievement
- Commitment to community service
- Shows Leadership, compassion and initiative
- A high degree of personal integrity and character
- Strong work ethic
- Participation in extracurricular school activities

Theodosia Gray Scholarship up to \$2,000 annual award:

- Preference to a female student
- Nontraditional learner/ Vocational training
- Show promise, not necessarily reflected in their academic record

Patsy Elliot Fogarty Scholarship \$2,000 annual award to the college and \$500 for unforeseen expenses paid directly to the student. (nonrenewable)

- Preference to a male student
- Enrolled as a full-time student in an accredited nursing program
- Minimum GPA 2.5

Each selected applicant must participate in an interview. Areas of focus may include high school interests, activities, personal goals and knowledge of the Maine Seacoast Mission.

Mandatory to attend at least one of the following Mission Scholars events:

- Leadership Workshop for 1st and 2nd year students (Mount Desert Island)- July 20, 2019
- Leadership Workshop for 3rd & 4 yr students (Mount Desert Island) – July 21, 2019
- Leadership Workshop for 1st and 2nd year students (Cherryfield) - August 2, 2019
- Leadership Workshop for 3rd & 4yr students (Cherryfield) August 3, 2019
